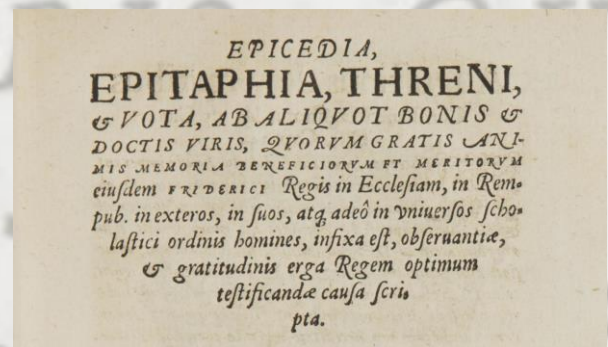

Death as Opportunity: The Role of Neo-Latin “Funerary Literature” in Sixteenth-Century Northern Europe

During the seminar, Anders will present an overview of his thesis focusing on how Neo-Latin occasional literature on the deaths of Lutheran kings Christian III (d. 1559) and Frederik II (d. 1588) of Denmark-Norway was composed to address issues in society relating to religion and politics as well as to (re-)negotiate or secure patronage relationships with the successor of the late king.
